

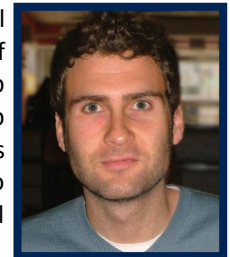
WELCOME, NEW FACULTY!



Sean Cleary's research interests focus on empirical investigations of corporate finance issues such as firm investment, financing and dividend decisions, as well as investing and portfolio management issues. His present research focuses on debt ratings and the role of earnings management by corporations. Sean has published numerous research articles in the *Journal of Finance*, the *Journal of Financial and Quantitative Analysis*, the *Journal of Banking and Finance*, the *Journal of Multinational Financial Management*, the *Journal of Financial Research*, the *International Journal of Managerial Finance*, the *Canadian Investment Review*, and the *Canadian Journal of Administrative Sciences*. He has received several research grants from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC), and serves on the editorial board and as a reviewer for many of the top finance journals. Dr. Cleary is also a co-author of several undergraduate Finance textbooks.

Sean is BMO Professor of Finance at the Queen's School of Business. he holds an MBA, a Ph.D. in Finance from the University of Toronto, is a Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) charter holder, and serves on the board of the Toronto CFA Society.

Christopher Miners' research focuses on abilities, personality traits, and intra- and interpersonal processes that facilitate job performance and promote well-being. He is interested in the influence of emotional intelligence and cognitive intelligence on social network centrality and on job performance. He is also interested in personality traits and emotions as they relate to job performance and to psychological and physical well-being. Christopher's current research examines the relation between emotional intelligence and leadership emergence. He has also started to examine job characteristics that serve as boundary conditions for the relation between emotional intelligence and job performance.



Christopher received his B.Sc. in Psychology from McGill University, and his Ph.D. in Organizational Behaviour and Human Resource Management from the University of Toronto.



Arcan Nalca's primary research interest lies in the field of supply chain management, especially in practically motivated research problems at the interface of operations and marketing focusing on inventory, capacity, and pricing decisions. Issues related to competition, coordination, and contracting in the presence of demand uncertainty constitute some of his research thrusts in this area. In his doctoral research, Arcan studied a specific retail pricing strategy - price-matching guarantees - that is a new topic in operations management literature and investigated how choices made by operations managers interact with and affect marketing, especially, pricing decisions.

Arcan received his Ph.D. from the Desautels Faculty of Management in McGill University.

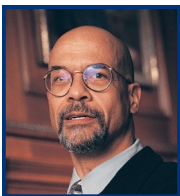

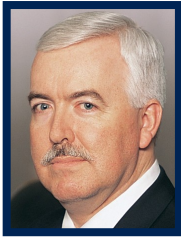

2008 HAIM FALK AWARD WINNER - PROFESSOR STEVEN E. SALTERIO



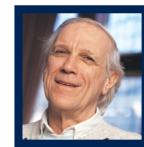
The Canadian Academic Accounting Association (CAAA) is pleased to announce that this year's winner of the Haim Falk Award for Distinguished Contribution to Accounting Thought is **Professor Steven E. Salterio**, the PricewaterhouseCoopers/Tom O'Neill Faculty Research Fellow in Accounting and Professor of Business at the School of Business, Queen's University. The award is given by the CAAA in recognition of a significant contribution to scholarly thinking and research in Canada through a body of work that clearly has contributed to the advancement of accounting thought.

Dr. Salterio has a strong record of publications in top research journals, working with a variety of co-authors in Canada and the U.S. Dr. Salterio has been a leading contributor to several fields of accounting research, including the balanced scorecard, auditor-client negotiation, corporate governance, and auditor consultation and review. He has been at the forefront of efforts to connect accounting to corporate governance challenges, as well as being a speaker and author in the general area of judgment and decision making. Dr. Salterio's papers have been widely cited and downloaded, and have been very influential in studying the balanced scorecard.

ECONOMICS OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND INNOVATION CONFERENCE



The first annual Economics of Entrepreneurship and Innovation Conference was held at Queen's School of Business from June 12th to June 14th. The inter-university organizing committee comprised of **Jean-Etienne de Bettignies** (QSB), **John McHale** (QSB), **Ajay Agrawal** (Rotman) and **Doug Cumming** (Schulich). Aiming to be one of the leading gatherings for entrepreneurship and innovation research, the conference attracted thirty-five leading scholars from across North America, including participants from Harvard, University of Pennsylvania (Wharton), Duke, Northwestern (Kellogg), Maryland (Smith) and

Wisconsin (Madison). Session topics included venture capital and entrepreneurship, the links between immigration and innovation, and organizational incentives for innovation.

The conference included a special presentation by **Ron Parker**, Senior Assistant Deputy Minister at Industry Canada. Mr. Parker, who heads Industry Canada's Strategic Policy Sector, described the challenges facing Canadian innovation and productivity and the importance of research in the policy making process. His presentation was followed by comments from an expert panel and a lively general discussion.

This year's conference was made possible with generous funding from QSB Research Office, the Monieson Centre, and from Industry Canada.

GENERAL RESEARCH GRANTS COMPETITION APPLICATION DEADLINE OCTOBER 20, 2008

The General Research Grants Competition supports faculty research that is likely to result in high quality academic publications. The General Research Grants Competition provides faculty with the opportunity to receive seed funding to embark in new research directions or to consolidate existing research.

When reviewing applications, the Research Committee will consider the purpose of this competition and consider that the funding should:

- [a] allow faculty maximum latitude to decide what is best for their research,
- [b] maintain the emphasis on quality as a major criterion in all funding decisions,
- [c] give preference to applications that include expenditures that are ineligible for funding from external agencies,
- [d] reward requests that will result in external funding applications, and
- [e] encourage high quality research at QSB.

The following activities would be considered eligible for funding within the General Research Grants Competition:

- Collaborative research between faculty and QSB graduate students
- Hosting research colleagues for protracted visits
- Hosting specialized methodology or statistical workshops
- Hosting visiting scholars
- Research conferences
- Research expenses
- Travel expenses

NEW RESEARCHER ACHIEVEMENT AWARD — FALL 2008

The primary goal of the annual New Researcher Achievement Award is the recognition of an individual faculty member whose research during the pre-tenured period is acknowledged as outstanding, and has brought credit to the Queen's School of Business. Receipt of this award will encourage on-going research that will continue to appear in high quality academic publications.

Eligibility

- All pre-tenured faculty members who have been employed at QSB for at least one year are automatically eligible for this award.
- Faculty members may receive this award once; thereafter, recipients will automatically be considered for the Award for Research Achievement.

RESEARCH ACHIEVEMENT AWARD — FALL 2008

The primary goal of the annual Award for Research Achievement is the recognition of an individual faculty member whose research over the past five years is acknowledged internationally as outstanding, and has brought considerable credit to the Queen's School of Business. Receipt of this award will encourage on-going research that will continue to appear in high quality academic publications.

Eligibility

- Tenured faculty members who have been employed at QSB for at least one year, and pre-tenured recipients of the New Researcher Achievement Award, are automatically eligible for consideration.
- Recipients may receive this award only once.
